

Certaines personnes en eurent assez d'attendre et rentrèrent chez elles.


Ebei se mit à pleurer. Il ne voulait pas rentrer chez lui.

Mais l'autocar n'était ni gros ni bleu. Il était petit et rouge.


Personne ne voulut monter dedans.
