








Les **hiboux** possèdent des griffes pointues, recourbées et puissantes qui leur permettent de saisir et emporter leur proie rapidement.

Les **aigles** possèdent quatre serres puissantes et pointues qui leur permettent de soulever des proies très lourdes.

Les **singes** utilisent leurs griffes pour attraper les poux dans les poils des autres singes.
