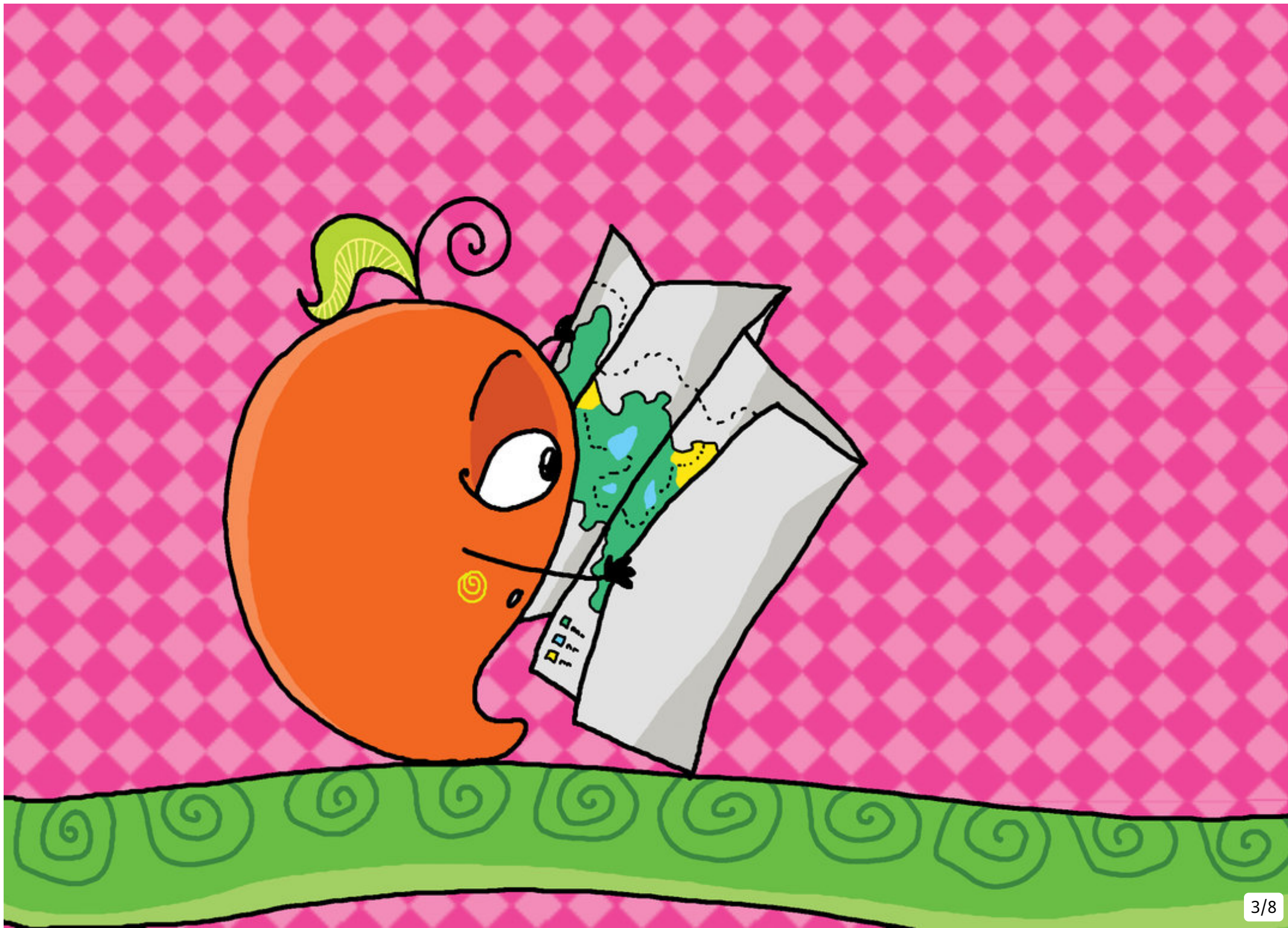

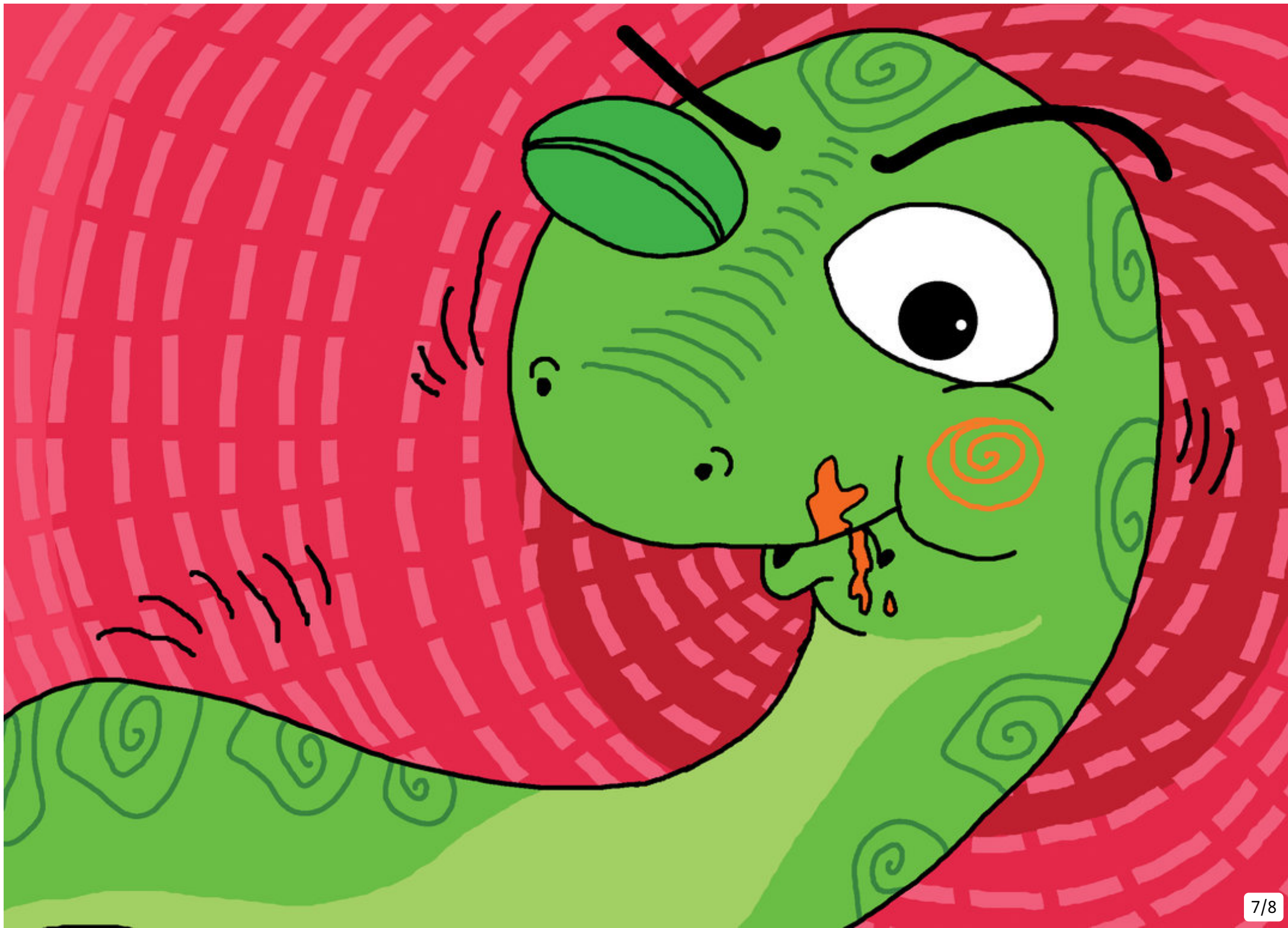












Vous vous demandez quoi faire avec des histoires sans mots?

Les histoires sans paroles sont merveilleuses car elles contiennent des possibilités infinies. Voici quelques idées pour s'amuser avec des enfants grâce aux histoires visuelles :

- Explorez l'histoire de manière tranquille. Attirez l'attention sur les détails - les expressions des personnages, le décor, les couleurs, etc. L'idée est que chaque enfant construise sa propre histoire. Si l'histoire est montrée à un groupe d'enfants, vous pouvez demander à chacun d'eux de contribuer à une ou deux phrases pour chaque illustration. Prenez plaisir à explorer chaque illustration et à construire l'histoire au fur et à mesure.
- Utilisez les thèmes explorés dans l'histoire pour commencer une discussion. Par exemple, dans cette histoire, vous pourriez demander aux enfants comment lire une carte, différents types de relief ou une discussion de classe sur le voyage.
- Encouragez les enfants à créer 2-3 histoires différentes en utilisant les mêmes visuels. Cela les aidera à faire travailler leur imagination.
