





peau.


Os: Le fémur Se trouvant dans la jambe, il peut supporter jusqu'à 30 fois le poids de notre corps.

Il se trouve dans les fesses. Il permet d'éviter que nous tombions vers l'arrière lorsque nous sommes debout ou nous marchons.




Les dents sont protégées par le plus solide des matériaux de notre corps: l'émail.


Il est même plus dur que nos os!

ZZZZZZZZ! RRRRRRRRR!



Certains organes de notre corps ne sont pas très importants.


