Plutôt que de picorer le sol, il voulait s'envoler vers des contrées lointaines.

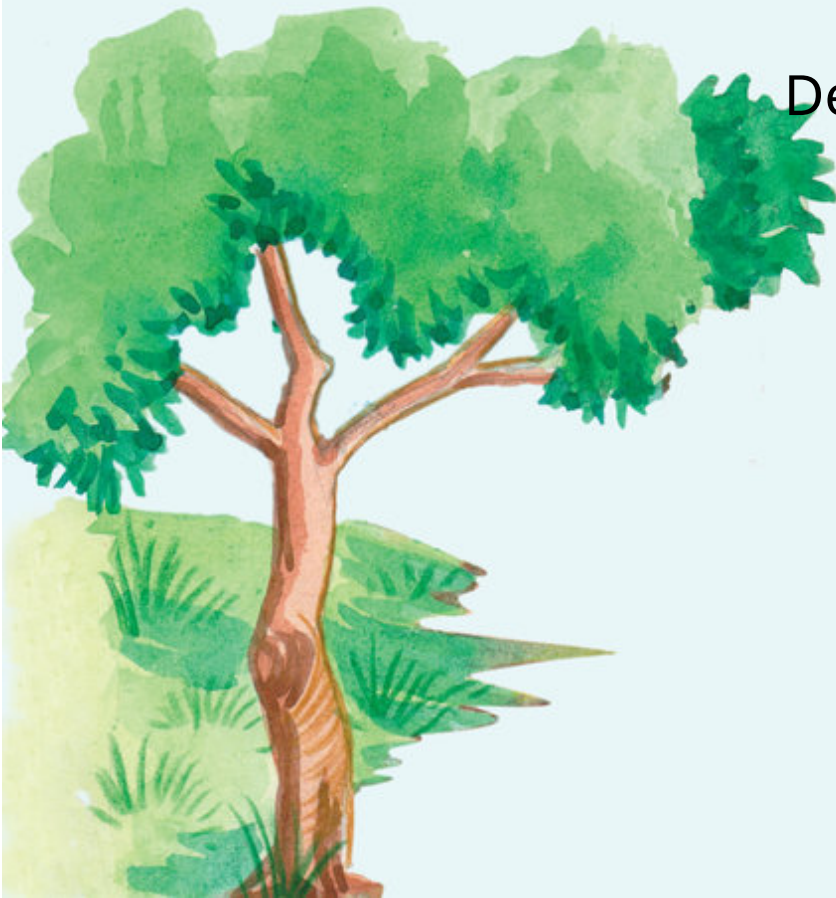
Il souhaitait découvrir par lui-même
