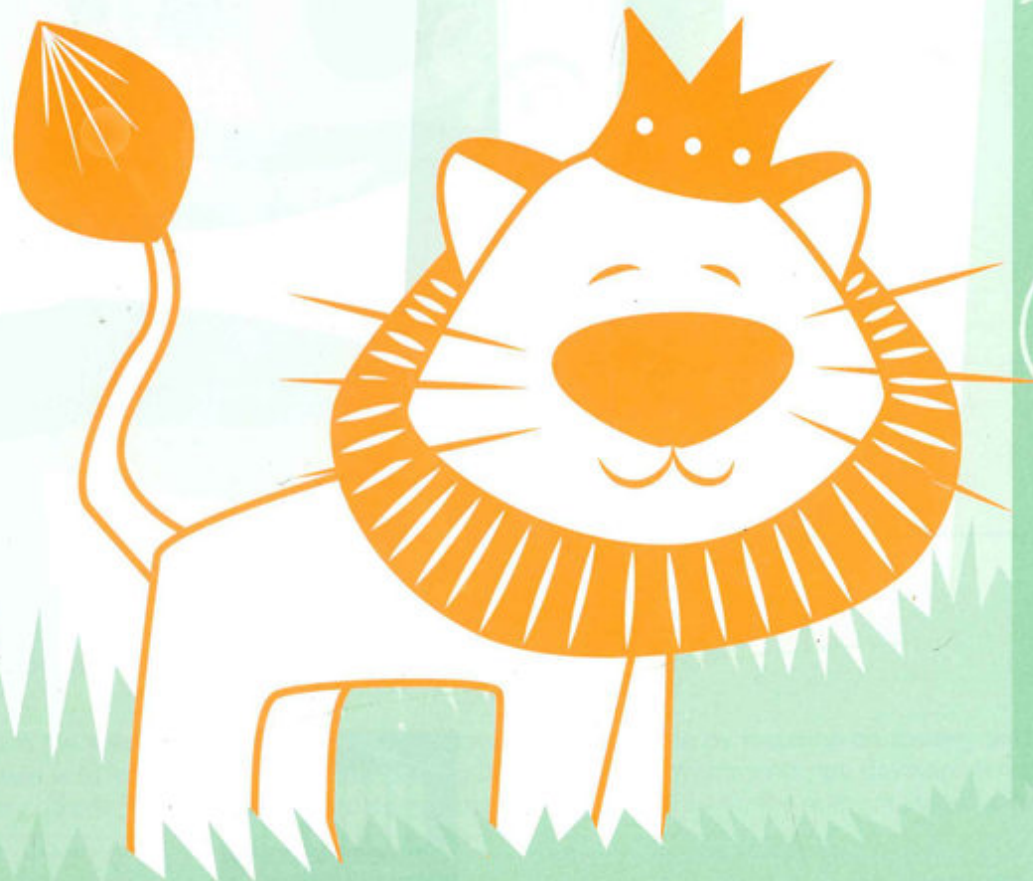

Il rugit : « Montre-moi mon ennemi. »

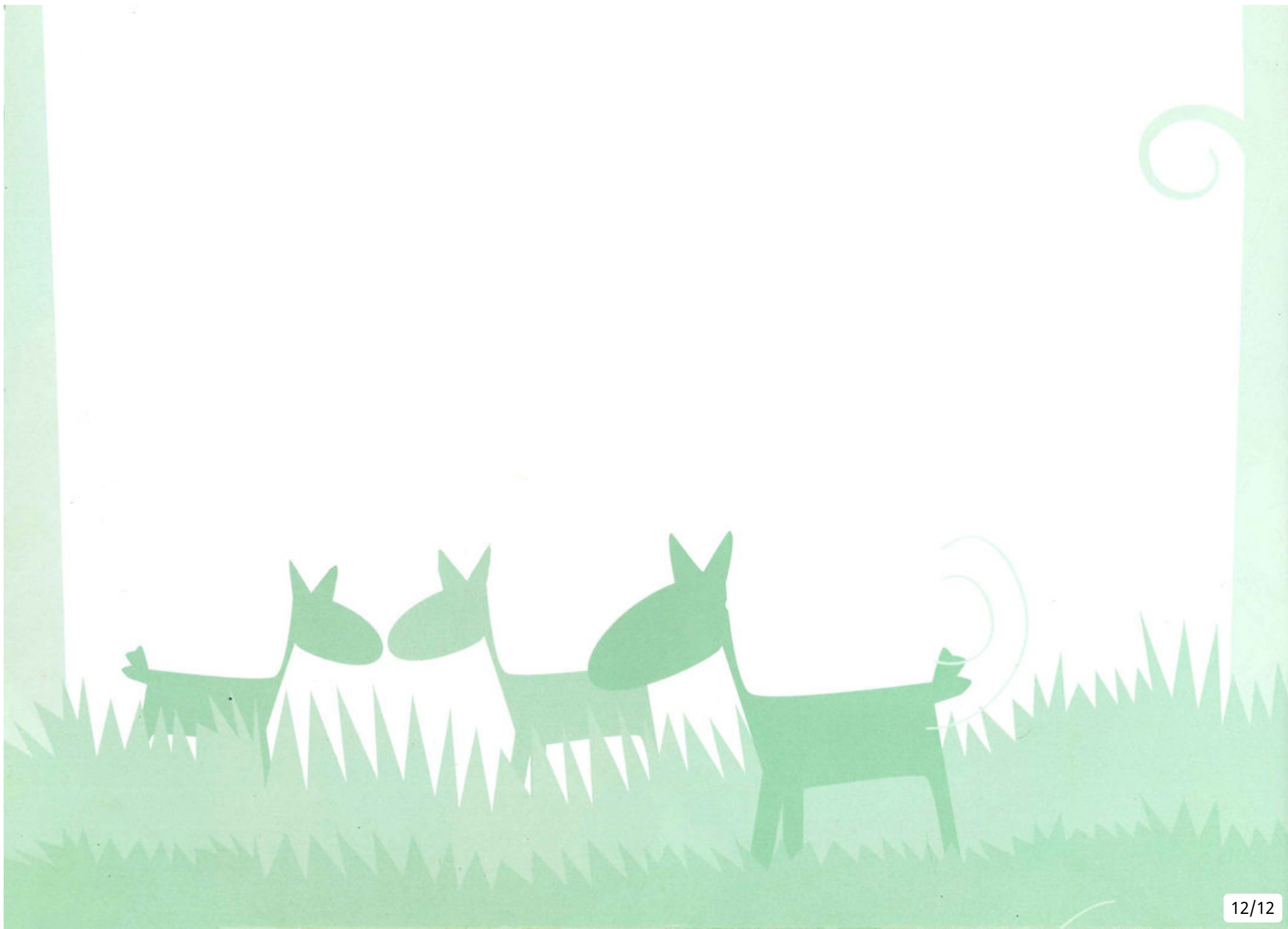
