

Bravo, Tra! fait le livre.




Maintenant, arrose-les.

« La ! La ! » chantonne Tra en arrosant les petites graines.




- Mes haricots rouges






Le lendemain, Tra laisse des instructions à sa maman tandis qu'elle part à l'école.

- Tu as lu ton livre ? interroge la maman de Tra.


Dans mes pages, il est écrit d'arroser la plante une seule fois par jour, se lamente le livre.

— Que dit ton livre ?répondent ses amies.




Oh, mince, j'ai arrêté de le lire!



Une fois rentrée chez elle, Tra montre la plante à sa maman.


Je suis désolée,

murmure Tra.


